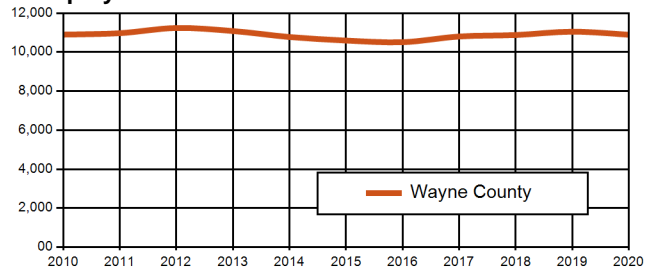

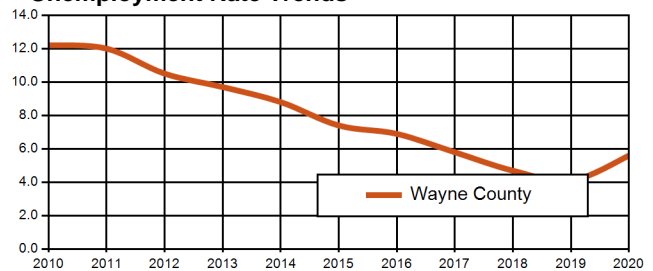

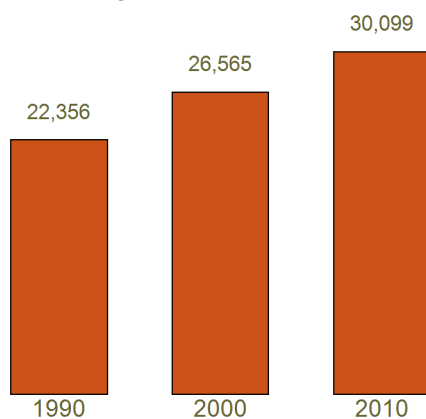
Unemployment Rate Trends

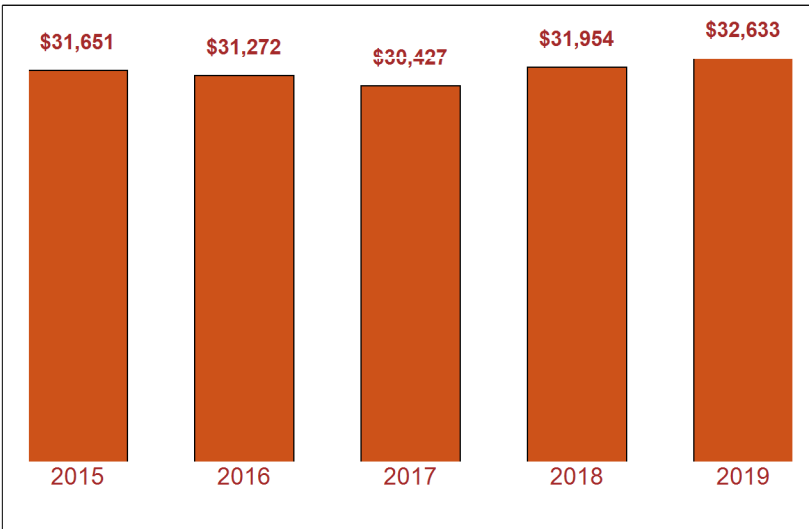

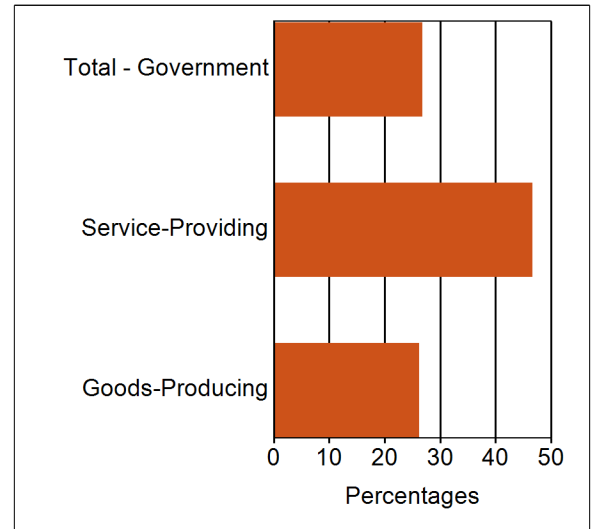
Wayne Per Capita Income
