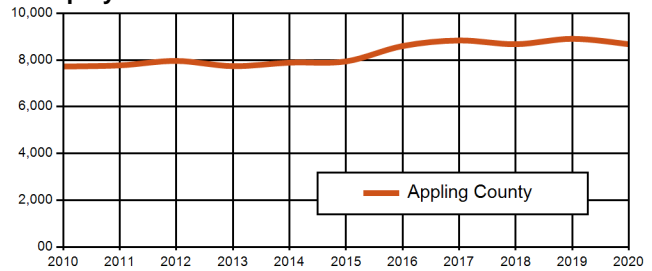

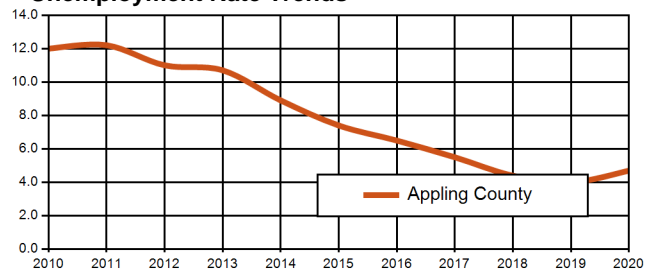

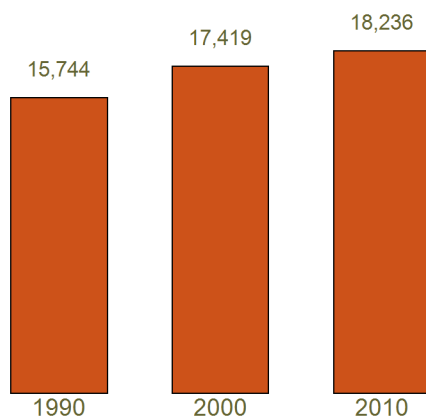
Employment Trends

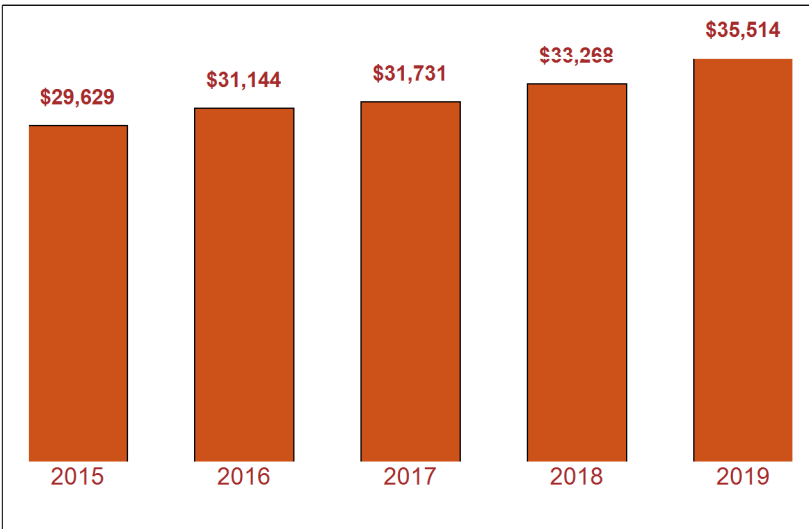

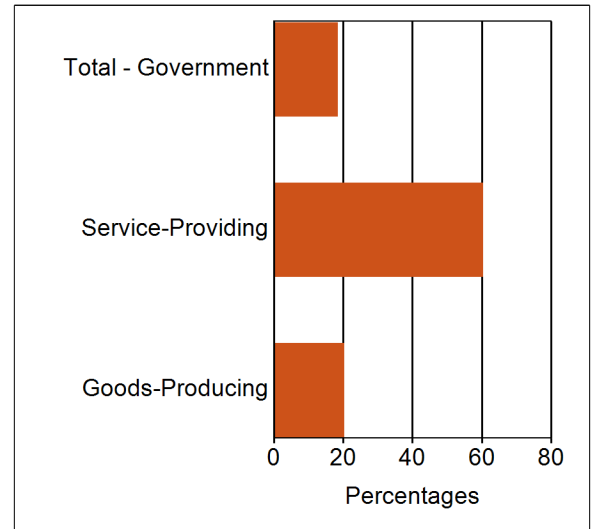
## Appling Per Capita Income
