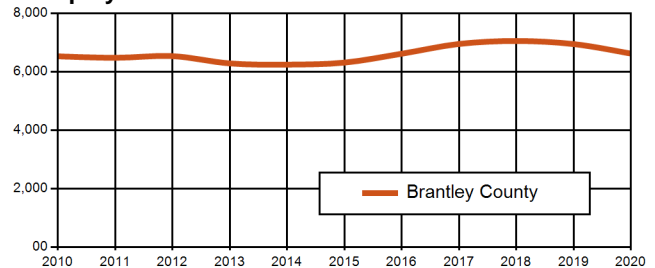

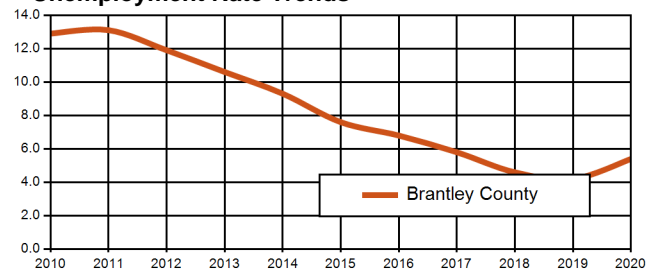

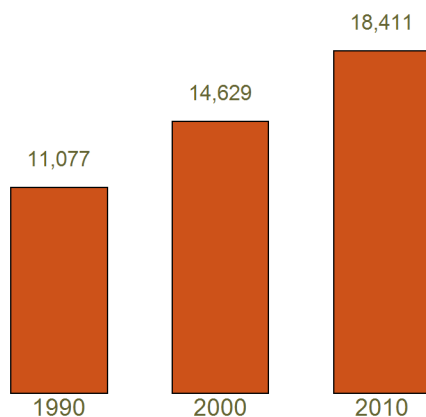

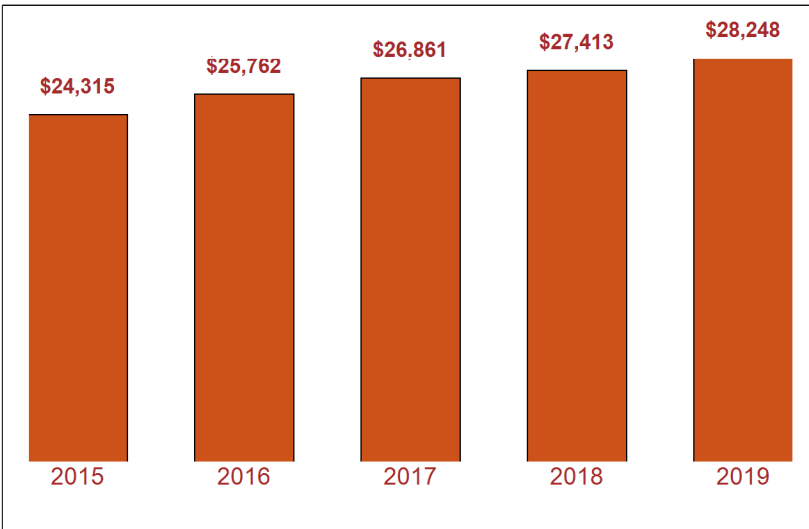

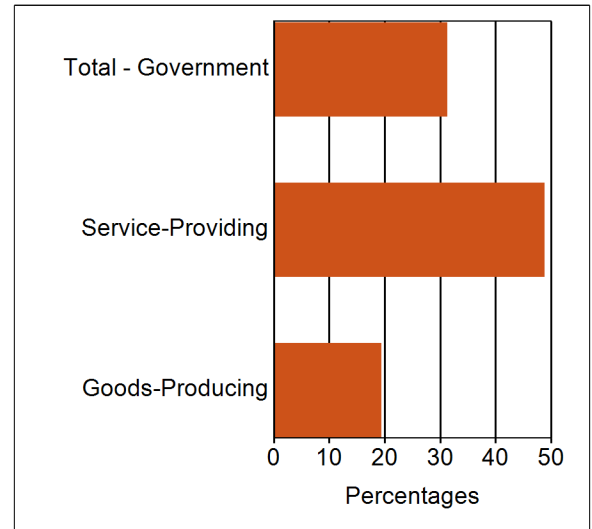
Brantley Per Capita Income
