

Articulation Agreement
between
Coastal Pines Technical College
and College of Coastal Georgia



Purpose:

This document establishes an articulation agreement between Coastal Pines Technical College (CPTC) and the College of Coastal Georgia (CCGA) that outlines coursework from CPTC that may be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood/Special Education degree offered by CCGA. In entering into the agreement, CPTC and CCGA have several goals, which include:

- Assisting prospective transfer students at CPTC with progression toward their baccalaureate degree goals;
- Enabling CPTC students to follow a course of study that makes them eligible to apply for program admission into the Early Childhood/Special Education educator preparation program at CCGA; and
- Facilitating cooperation between counseling offices and transfer centers at their respective institutions.

The College of Coastal Georgia in partnership with the Coastal Pines Technical College has developed transfer procedures to implement this agreement. To assure that the articulation agreement remains current, the respective parties agree to consult regularly on issues of enrollment, articulation, and course or curriculum changes (e.g., learning outcomes in courses and design of field experience in EDUC courses). The goal of both CPTC and CCGA is to minimize barriers to transfer and increase the number of students who successfully complete the baccalaureate degree in Early Childhood and Special Education.

Justification:

Coastal Pines Technical College and the Department of Education and Teacher Preparation at the College of Coastal Georgia are entering into this articulation agreement to develop a pathway by which students can apply coursework taken at CPTC to the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood/Special Education degree at CCGA. By completing the requirements for the Associate of Applied Science in Education at CPTC and Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood/Special Education from CCGA, graduates will be highly prepared to seek employment in schools as educators

dually certified in P-5 elementary and special education, to pursue advanced degrees in education, or to work in education-related fields.

Terms of Articulation:

This joint agreement covers CPTC graduates of the AAS in Education who are accepted as candidates for the BS in Early Childhood/Special Education degree at CCGA.

College of Coastal Georgia will accept general education core courses for transfer as specified in the articulation agreement between the University System of Georgia and accredited colleges of the Technical College System of Georgia. In addition, and regardless of the student's degree status with Coastal Pines, CCGA will accept AREA F courses as indicated on the chart below: EDUC 2110, EDUC 2120, EDUC 2130, EDUC 2001 (Science for Elementary Educators), and EDUC 2008 (Math for Educators). A grade of C or better in Area F courses is required for admission into the Early Childhood and Special Education program.

A minimum GPA of 2.0 out of a 4.0 scale for all college course work attempted is required for admission to CCGA. Prospective candidates for the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood/Special Education must complete a minimum of 60-semester hours of academic work and have a minimum GPA of 2.5 to apply for admission into the Early Childhood/Special Education program. All other University System of Georgia and CCGA requirements for admission into the Early Childhood/Special Education program and for acceptance of credit must be satisfied.

The course list may be amended by written agreement of the Department Chair for Education and Teacher Preparation at CCGA and the Vice President for Academic Affairs at CPTC. The following chart is the recommended plan of study.
