



UNDUPLICATED CREDIT ENROLLMENT BY YEAR (51.5% Increase in Enrollment in Four Years)








The Economic Development Division supports the mission of Coastal Pines Technical College and strives to be Southeast Georgia's premier source for workforce development solutions through four primary functions:

ADULT EDUCATION

The Adult Education program at Coastal Pines Technical College is specifically designed for adults who need assistance with academic skills. Programs offer flexible schedules that meet the needs of any individual who wishes to participate. Classes and supplies are free of charge. Students who obtain a GED® and go on to further their education receive a \$500 HOPE voucher for continuing their education.

- 1,167 students enrolled.
- **561** learning levels completed.
- 326 GEDs awarded.
- 404 test takers took all four GED exams.
- 511 test takers took at least one GED exam.

CLUBS IN ACTION















Student Activities started the spring and fall semesters with "Back to School" events on the main sites with coffee, pastries, and other treats along with information about how to get involved sponsored by Student Government Association (SGA). Special treats were taken to the smaller sites to welcome them back to the semester. SGA sponsored eight blood drives with the American Red Cross throughout the year. SGA also sponsored various informational challenges in 2019, including Black History Month, Mental Health Awareness, Constitution Day, National Voter Registration Day, and Veterans Day. SGA co-sponsored events with other CPTC departments, such as Make a Ray, Goin' Coastal, Non-Traditional Student focus groups, TRF, Library Game Days, Adult Education recruitment activities, and ProctorU training. Resource Fairs were held on the three main sites to help connect students to resources in the community that can help them be successful. One of the most fun events each semester is Student Activity Days, which give the students an opportunity to enjoy each other and always include fun giveaways, activities, and great food!

The other student organizations were busy building membership and competing in 2019! SkillsUSA took ten students and six advisors to the Georgia SkillsUSA Competition, with one student placing first in Medical Assisting and representing CPTC at the National Competition in Kentucky. Phi Beta Lambda took six students and two advisors to the Georgia Student Leadership Conference, after which three students won to compete at the National Competition in San Antonio, Texas. National Technical Honor Society inducted 61 students in 2019. The HORT Club remains very active on the Waycross campus, including Plant Sales, campus beautification, Earth Day celebrations, education, and regular meetings. Lambda Nu also remained active, spreading their name through the Radiologic Technology field and helping students grow through the year. Seventeen students representing all organizations and three advisors traveled to Atlanta for the Georgia Fall Leadership Conference to learn and grow.

The Student Activities Coordinator worked with many constituents to create a new online Orientation platform with customized tracks for traditional and Dual Enrollment students. With the implementation of this new option for students who cannot attend in person, we saw a 141% increase in orientation participation from the previous year.
